

'VINTAGE RUN' NOW PLANNED

The Griffith Town to Lake run on Saturday proved such a success that the organisers are already planning a similar event during the Vintage Festival next year.

A spokesman for the organisers, Mr. Peter Tuziak, said yesterday it was expected that about 2000 people could take part in the Vintage Festival event.

"We have already been promised sponsorship for some of the major prizes, including one of a two-week stay in Sydney in preparation for the 1975 Sydney to Surf run", he said.

More than 300 entries were received for Saturday's Griffith Town to Lake run, but the actual number on the starting line at the Wade Shire Council chambers dropped to about 250.

in a time of 40 minutes 55 people approached for prizes".
