## AUSTIN WINS BACCHUS IN CLOSE FINISH

Steve Austin overcame fierce competition from a world class field to win the Bacchus 12,000 on Easter Saturday.

The Moscow Olympics nominee had to call on his powerful finish to beat the aggressive front running NSW trio of Poulton, McDonald and Andrews in the last 500 metres.

Weather conditions were not good for distance running with the heat and strong wind affecting times and forcing many competitors to withdraw.

Over 3,000 people were at the start to see the Minister for Agriculture, Mr Hallam, fire the starting gun and set the 500 Bacchus and half Bacchus runners on their way.

At the three kilometre mark there were eight runners in the leading bunch. It was clear that

the presence of Austin, the national 5,000 and 10,000 metres champion would force a fast early pace since he was the fastest finisher in the field.

The expected threat from fellow Olympian, Peter Larkins, the national 3,000 steeplechase champion, did not even tuate because he was treating the Bacchus only as a training run.

When the runners entered the Ex Servicemen's Oval at the halfway mark, the

leading group had been reduced to five with Wayne Brennan, John Andrews, Steve Poulton and Austin striding strongly.

Glyn Cox was within a few minutes of the leaders and looked a certainty to take the Wade Shire resident award.

The first woman at the halfway mark was Megan Pye followed by Sue Bradley and Belinda Braniff of Griffith.

Near the top of Scenic Hill, Rob McDonald made his move to shake off Austin.

The 1975 and 1979 world cross country representative burst out of the pack and charged down the hill.

Unfortunately for McDonald, he developed a stitch on the downhill run and was passed by Poulton and Austin in that order.

With the new Bacchus course around Probert and Blumer Avenues, the crowd was able to see the three fighting for the winning break.

Just before they entered the oval gate, Austin surged to the front ahead of Poulton and McDonald.

In the last thrilling 300 metres, McDonald was able to make up a little ground on Poulton, but Austin charged to the line in 38 minutes, 19 seconds to win.

Poulton was 12 metres

behind and McDonald another 10 metres back. John Andrews was next to finish from Robert Leylan.

Less than three minutes separated the first 11 runners with Peter Larkins in the 11th place with 41.04.

Griffith athlete, Glyn Cox, ran a superb 19th place in 43.35 to finish first of the Wade Shire

residents. Steve Kocaj (40) and Ross O'Meara (42) were the next Wade Shire residents home and these three put in the best ever local performances in the Bacchus 12,000.

Cox won the East Griffith Pharmacy award of a return air fare to contest the Sydney City to Surf classic.

The first woman home was Megan Pye of Box Hill, with Australian representative Sue Bradley second. Times were 48.57 for Pye (57th place) and 50.28 for Bradley (75th place).

Diminutive 12 year old Kerryn Hindmarsh, of Bulli, won the hearts of the crowd as she finished third in 50.39.

Griffith's Belinda Braniff was fifth and the first Wade Shire woman to finish.

With serious training and racing experience, she should be able to face in the major cross country titles this year.

As expected, Box Hill Amateur Athletics Club won the Athletic Club teams event from Glenhuntly and ACT Cross Country Clubs.

Tumbarumba took out the open division and Griffith Flyweights won the Wade Shire residents' title from Druids.

For his win, Steve Austin was awarded \$1,000 in air fares from Fred Eardley's, which

sponsored the race.

Steve Poulton, who won a Bacchus New Zealand air fare last year, was awarded another Fred Eardley prize of \$500 in air fares, while Megan Pye also took out a \$500 air fare award as first woman finisher.

The Griffith Athletics Club award of \$300 in air fares for the lucky draw for third to 10th place getters and second and third women place getters, was won by Colin Leaver from the ACT.

Cross Country Club who came home 10th.

The lucky draw prize of a return air fare to New Zealand (for which all Bacchus and half Bacchus runners were eligible), was won by Griffith's Glyn Cox, who, by an incredible coincidence, was also the first Wade Shire finisher.

Full details of awards and times of all runners in the Bacchus 12,000 will be published in a later edition of "The Area News".

## YOUTH SHOWS OUT IN B'BALL UPSET

The star of the meeting was Griffith's Fiona Prest with four gold medals and three new records.

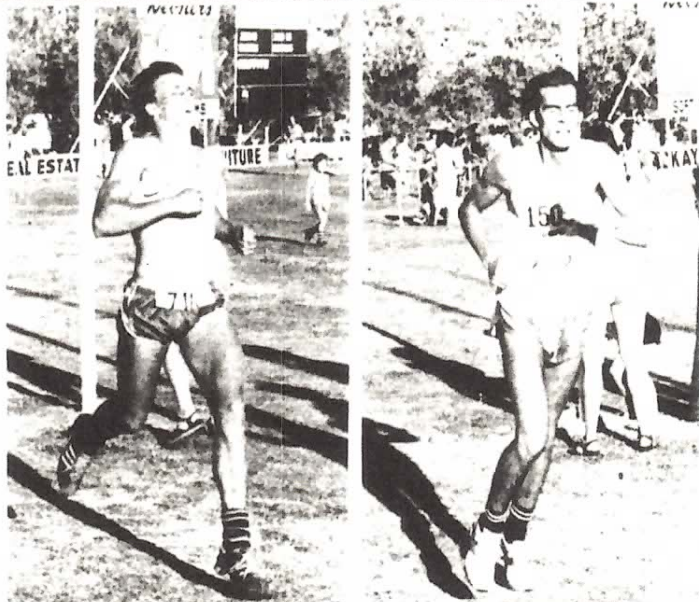
Her wins were in the long jump, 100 metres and 400 metres, but her top performance was in the 200 metres, an event in which she had to go into a higher age group.
